JUSTICE AND CHARITY

The following story tells of a case in which Jubilee Churches was able to assist in keeping someone from experiencing homelessness.

Jubilee Churches was able to step in and help a neighbor who was facing the threat of losing her home. After faithfully working as an assistant manager at a local convenience store, she suddenly saw her hours reduced in August when sales dropped. With less income, she quickly fell behind on her rent. By September, she had received a five-day eviction notice with a balance of \$1,860.00, which included a \$130.00 late fee. But thanks to the support of Jubilee Churches, we were able to act quickly. The client herself contributed \$500.00 from her paycheck, showing her commitment to regaining stability. The Samaritan Group stepped in with \$400.00. Together, these efforts lowered her balance to \$830.00. With her hours now fully restored for September, she confidently told us she will be able to cover October's rent without issue. Because of your generosity, this family was able to avoid homelessness and keep a roof over their heads. Stories like this remind us that even a short setback can put hardworking families at risk—but with compassion and partnership, we can make all the difference.
